Count Me In! Campaign Kicks Off During Exciting District Growth and State Funding Uncertainty

Having a continuing local source of funds that supplement what the district receives from the state and through local option funds is critical for providing the quality that defines WLWV schools.

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WLWV Best Graduation Rates Again!

The Oregon Department of Education released graduation rates in January and the district saw an overall improvement of more than 0.5%, posting a district average of 93%, significantly beating the statewide average of 74.83%.

WLWV came out ahead of the vast majority of school districts across the state, including familiar districts like the Lake Oswego School District (91.67 percent) and the Tigard-Tualatin School District (83.66 percent).
